Cultural Exchange:

The cultural exchange is a process of looking at the factors that have determined our makeup and our personality and to assess whether we have made the right choices. Cultural exchange is basically a two way process, a process of education, evaluation, reflection, understanding and learning to enrich and enhance the personal as well as the community life.

Charity:
